Hiram Green, III, passed away on March 4th, 2024, at his Tallahassee Apartment. He was a long-time resident of Tallahassee and graduated from Godby High School. Hiram was an accomplished chef and in his younger years, he worked at some of Tallahassee's finest restaurants. He also had a lovely singing voice and had the opportunity to tour Europe with a choral ensemble.

When Hiram was in his twenties, he was an active member of Covenant Community Church and sang with their worship team. The friendships he formed there would last a lifetime. In his later years he was able to reconnect with many of these friends via Facebook. Hiram never married and had no children. These church friends were like family to him.

During his middle years, Hiram walked away from God. As time passed, he found himself homeless. He had a heart attack and was not in good health. This was a dark season of his life. He returned to Jesus through the ministry of Haven of Rest rescue mission on Tennessee Street. He lived there and worked as the cook providing meals to the 30-40 men who called Haven of Rest their home. He loved being part of that ministry.

Eventually Hiram was able to get a small apartment by himself where he lived alone for the last 8 years of his life. He enjoyed creating recipes, cooking great meals, spending time daily in reading his Bible and prayer, and communicating with friends on Facebook. His cat, Cocoa, was his companion. He lived a simple life.

Hiram was born on September 13, 1953, to his parents, Hiram Green, Jr. and Evelyn Blich Green. He is preceded in death by his parents and his only sibling, Randy Wallace Green. Hiram's ashes are buried at the Serenity Cemetery on Crawfordville Road but his spirit is alive in heaven singing praises to God. Hiram is home.
