Jaden Parenteau (11), Marliee Parenteau (10), Imani Bennet (8), and Chavelle Bennett (7), were all the first things she thought about when she woke up in the morning, the last things she thought about when she went to bed at night, and they filled her entire day with more happiness than you can imagine. There was nothing in the world that brought her more joy than her kids. If you were looking for Jade, you would most likely find her with her kids - playing, taking them places, and spending time with them outdoors. They were her pride and joy, her true loves, and the most important thing in her life.

Linda Parenteau, Jade's mother, has countless memories to share of Jade growing up. Jade was always a free spirit. While she was growing up, Jade and her mother spent cherished time together, with Jade participating in everything from gymnastics and cheerleading, to most every school-related activity there was. They shared a relationship that can only be described as

"fun," "fabulous," "exciting," and "extremely close". They truly enjoyed the time they got to spend together. When Jade had her liver transplant in 2015 her mother never left her side, and they have been together ever since. Linda laughed at the good times, gritted her teeth through the trying times (in case you didn't know, teenage girls knowing everything), but Jade knew without a doubt that no matter what, her mother would be there, standing by her side and supporting her. And Linda always was taking care of Jade's boo-boo's as a young child, getting her on track as a wild child, and caring for her through her illness ... up to Jade's last moment on earth.

Jade's sister, Michelle Manuele, was actually there to see Jade enter into this world. Not something many siblings get to see and what probably explains the incredible bond that the two have shared with each other. Jade loved her big sister like none other, and Michelle's love for Jade was the same. Jade admired Michelle, looked up to her and respected her for that special woman that Michelle grew up to be. Two sisters, very different, but joined together with the greatest love and fun times they shared as kids growing up, and into adulthood. 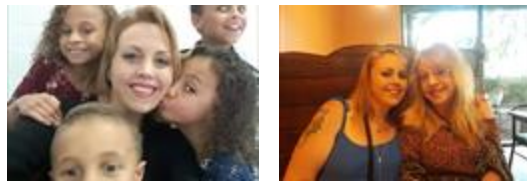
