Marvin Lanier Suber, 78, of Tallahassee, passed away Saturday, October 31, 2020 after a lengthy battle with cancer. He was born in Sawdust, FL on December 15, 1941 to Marvin Orville Suber and Winnie Sears Suber, but lived most of his life in Tallahassee working as a Certified Public Accountant.
